Superintendent, Frank Scarafile, responded that there is a full-time aide in the morning, an additional support teacher in the afternoon, desks were brought in to replace tables, the teacher has excellent classroom management skills, and administrators monitor and evaluate frequently.
  - Sharon Cartier expressed concern with the reading level assessment in grade 2, what program is being used and is there enough time. Superintendent, Frank Scarafile, responded that Renaissance Star Learning is the assessment program being administered throughout the school year.
  - Nancy Cano expressed concern with the class size of grade 2, feels her child is being held back stating that his reading level now is the same as in May in grade 1.
  - Greg Keelen spoke regarding recent Moonachie Education Association achievements. He praised staff reading specialist, Nicole Wohlrab, with her contribution of the shared library, ebook room, end of year book and family literacy night.
  - Greg Keelen expressed a tremendous thank you and congratulations to the students of the Class of 2015 and the parents of the Class of 2015 for all their efforts with the Tricky Tray fundraiser. He indicated that over \$15,000 was raised for the student's Washington DC trip in May 2015.
